- Jean Watson, RN, PhD, FAAN, is Distinguished Professor and Dean Emerita, University of Colorado Denver, College of Nursing Anschutz Medical Center campus, where she held the nation's first endowed Chair in Caring Science for 16 years. She is Founder and Director of non-profit foundation, Watson Caring Science Institute.
- Marcia Hills, RN, PhD, FAAN, is a Professor at the School of Nursing, Faculty of Human and Social Development, University of Victoria, British Columbia, Canada. She is a Distinguished Caring Science Scholar (WCSI) and is the Founder and current President of the Global Alliance for Human Caring Education (GAHCE).
- Peggy L. Chinn, RN, PhD, FAAN, is Professor Emerita of Nursing at the University of Connecticut and she currently teaches doctoral level courses for the University of Connecticut, Florida Atlantic University, and Louisiana State University.
- Janet F. Quinn, RN, PhD, FAAN, is an international speaker and consultant. She is one of the earliest pioneers in Therapeutic Touch practice and research and in Holistic Nursing and has taught both all over the world.
- Lisa Bourque Bearskin, RN, PhD, a member of Beaver Lake Cree Nation in Treaty 6 Territory, is an Associate Professor and New Researcher in the School of Nursing at the Thompson Rivers University. She was past-president of the Canadian Indigenous Nurses Association, from 2013-2017.

CONFERENCE STRUCTURE

HCC2019 takes place over two days - Monday, 30th September and Tuesday, 1st October 2019.

- Both days begin and end with a Plenary Session and both afternoons begin with a Discourse and Dialogue Session, also in a plenary gathering.
- 1-1/2 hours each morning and afternoon are dedicated to concurrent breakout sessions.
- Morning and afternoon refreshment breaks and lunch are provided each day.
- Monday early evening is reserved for our gala reception in the First People's Gallery at the Royal British Columbia Museum.
- Five pre-conference workshops (ticketed separately) have been arranged for Sunday, 29 September 2019, the day before the HCC2019 opening.

All plenary gatherings take place in the Lecture Theatre of the Victoria Conference Centre providing comfortable tiered seating, each one equipped with a fold-out writing desk.

CONCURRENT BREAKOUT SESSIONS

90 minutes each morning and again each afternoon are set aside for concurrent smaller group presentations in 5 different formats. Workshops, Symposia, and World Cafés span the full 90 minutes. Oral and E-Poster presentations are 25 minutes each - 3 such presentations are scheduled per room per 90 minute session with 5 minutes allocated between presentations to move between them.

The schedules included here are colour coded to show the conference sub-theme that has been allocated to each presentation. Where possible, presentations (in all formats) are grouped according to theme.

All Oral Presentations, Symposia, and Workshops will take place in the 8 conference rooms located on the main level of the Victoria Conference Centre (VCC). E-Poster Presentations will be in Pre-Function Space 1, either side of the registration desk. The World Café sessions (Monday only) will be in the Bengal Room of the Empress Hotel, just down the hallway from the VCC!

Cultivating Caring Contexts in Indigenous Human Rights.

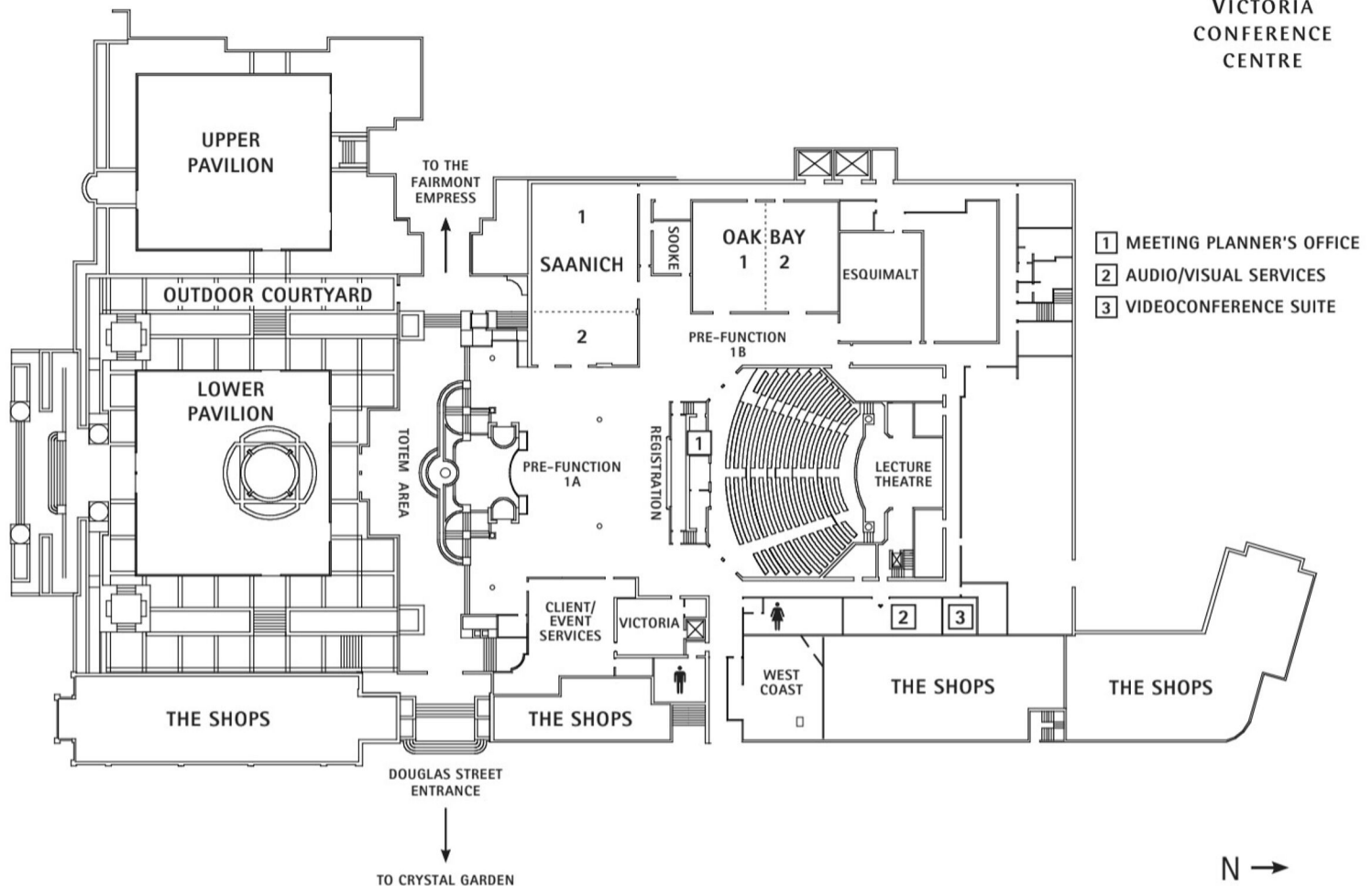
